Circling Swallows block is on the Jenks/Shantz home, (1945 lumber shed) from a five-generation family quilt. * Private residence.




3. 1778 N. Weaver Rd, Fairview


6. 115 West 8th St, Mio.

7. 3962 Palmer Rd, Luzerne.


A Wedding Ring block adorns the garage of the Williams family home. Maria is a quilter and loves traditional quilt patterns.


8. 412 Morenci, Mio.


10. 1871 N Caldwell Rd, Mio

is the home of this Ohio Snowflake block. It is a traditional Amish pattern and reflects the owners heritage.




12. 115 Deyarmond St, Mio.




